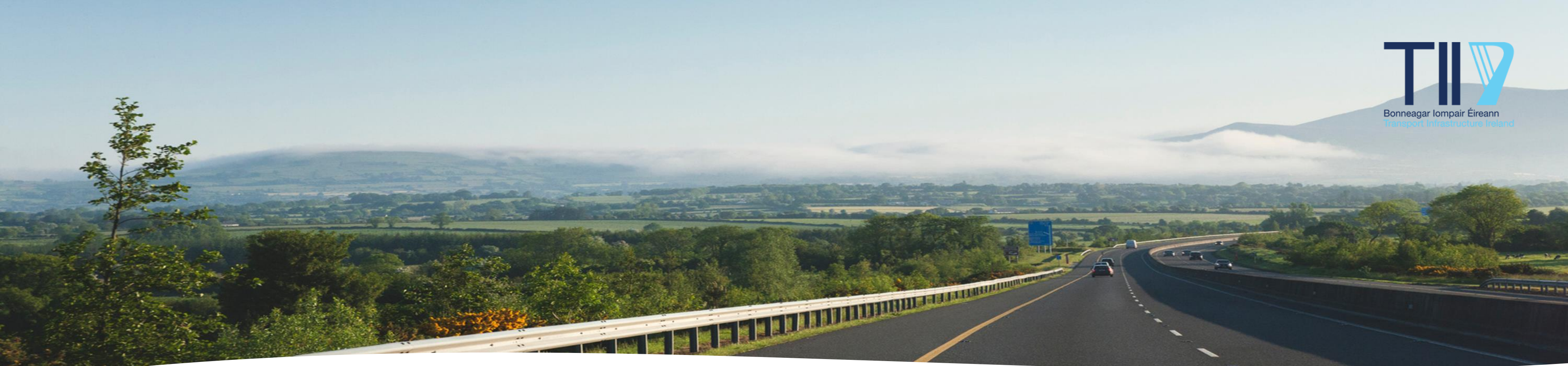

# Background to TII

- **Transport Infrastructure Ireland (TII)** was formed following the merger of the **National Roads Authority (NRA)** and the **Railway Procurement Agency (RPA)**
  - NRA established in 1993, under the Roads Act 1993
  - RPA established in 2001, under the Transport (Railway Infrastructure) Act 2001
  - TII established in 2015, under the Roads Act 2015
- TII's growing, dynamic workforce of 300 technical and professional experts play a **pivotal role in the transformation of the transport sector**, in line with Ireland's National Development Plan.





## Purpose

TII's purpose is to provide **sustainable transport infrastructure and services**, delivering a **better quality of life**, supporting **economic growth** and **respecting the environment**.

## Function

TII's function is to provide an integrated approach to the future development and operation of the **national roads network** and **light rail infrastructure** throughout Ireland.

## Strategy

National Roads 2040 (NR2040), which will allow TII to **enable Project Ireland 2040**, responding to evolving national policy and aligning to the Department of Transport's National Investment Framework for Transport in Ireland (NIFTI).

# Road Network

- TII operates, maintains and improves the **National Road Network (NRN)** which consists of **National Primary roads** and **National Secondary roads**.
- This includes **Motorways, Dual Carriageways, and Single-Lane Roads**, playing a central role in sustainably transporting people and goods across Ireland.
- **Collaboration** also takes place between the **Department of Transport (DoT) and TII**, ensuring a common understanding of the network function, current and future users' and infrastructure requirements on the network, to enable Project Ireland 2040.

The NRN is a critical backbone for the economic, social, and cultural connectivity across Ireland

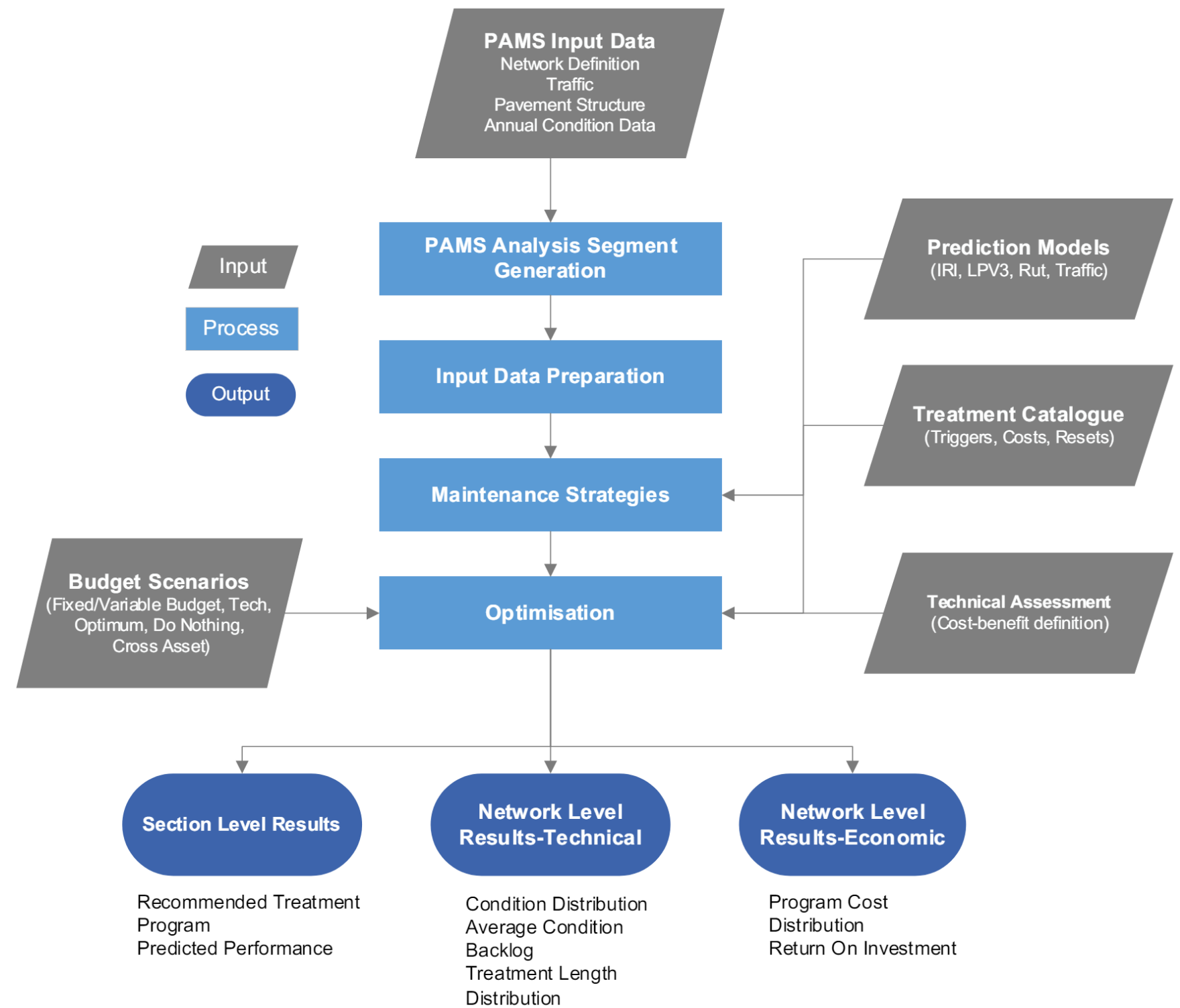

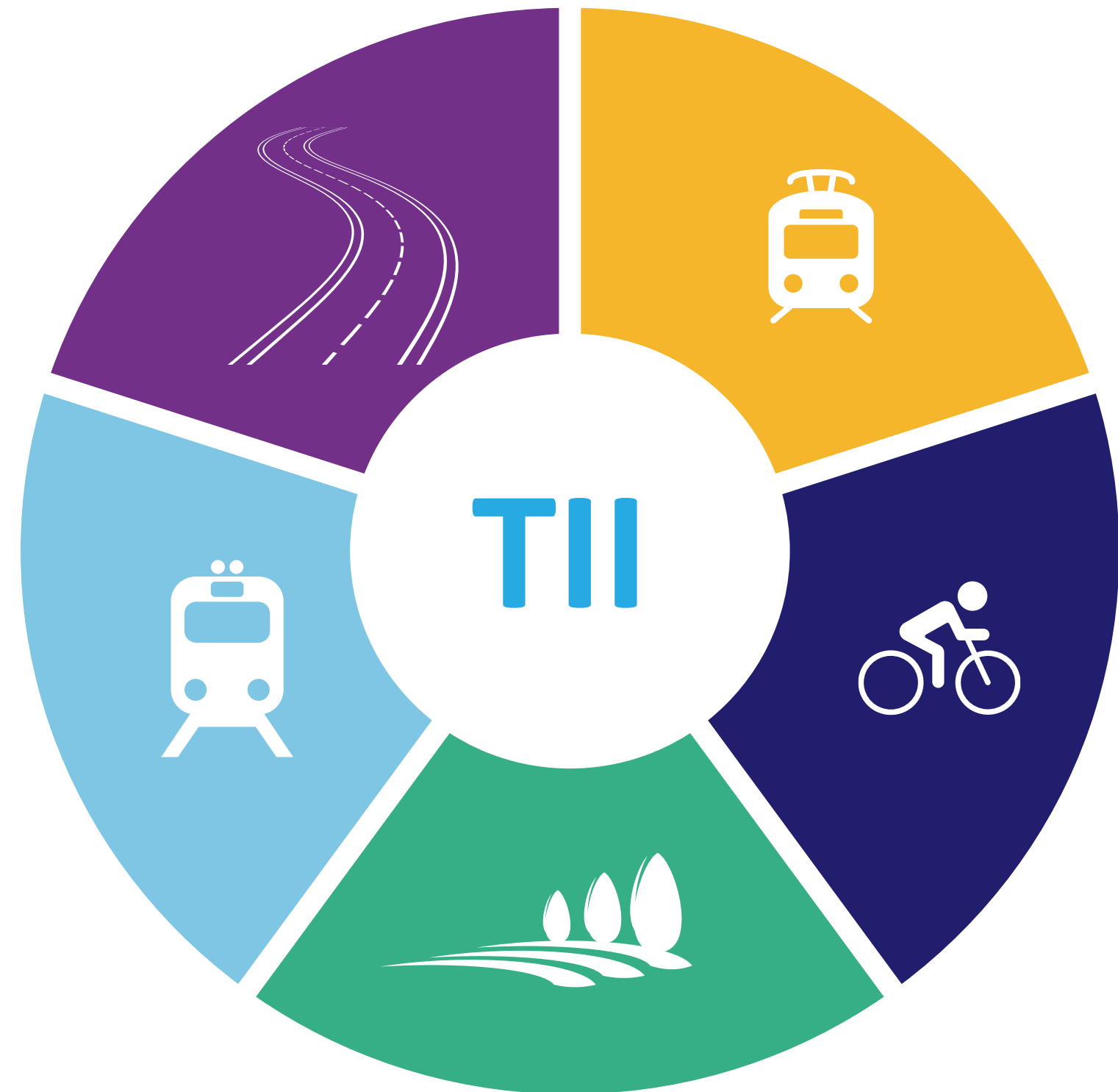
# Public Transport & Active Travel
